7	Golden-winged Warbler	<i>Vermivora chrysoptera</i>	2, 3
8	Canada Warbler	<i>Cardellina [Wilsonia] Canadensis</i>	2, 3

¹ Corridors 1-2 refer to the areas around our Río Silanche & Milpe Bird Sanctuaries, respectively. Corridor 3 encompasses the area around the Puyucunapi, Oreothraupis and Tandayapa reserves.
