¹ Corridors 1-2 refer to the areas around our Río Silanche & Milpe Bird Sanctuaries, respectively. Corridor 3 encompasses the area around the Puyucunapi, Oreothraupis and Tandayapa reserves. The IUCN Red List, Vulnerable species, Andean Spectacled Bear (*Tremarctos ornatus*) is also present in corridor 3.
