2	Olive-sided Flycatcher	<i>Contopus cooperi</i>	1
3	Bay-breasted Warbler	<i>Setophaga [Dendroica] castanea</i>	2, 3
4	Cerulean Warbler	<i>Setophaga [Dendroica] cerulean</i>	2, 3
5	Swallow-tailed Kite	<i>Elanoides forficatus</i>	1, 2, 3
6	Peregrine Falcon	<i>Falco peregrinus</i>	3
7	Golden-winged Warbler	<i>Vermivora chrysoptera</i>	2, 3
8	Canada Warbler	<i>Cardellina [Wilsonia] Canadensis</i>	2, 3
